"If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." Luke 9:23

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 10th, and runs to Holy Saturday, March 26th. Early on the Church recognized that meeting the Crucified and Resurrected Lord on Easter morning took preparation. Thankfully, God gifted the church with all she needed to ready herself to faithfully come face to face with Christ during the Easter Celebration of Holy Communion. The gifts that God gives include: repentance, fasting and giving.

At first, the church only required new converts to enter this intense period of preparation. They did this because, the Church welcomed Converts into full membership on Easter through Baptism and their first Communion. By the 4th Century, though, the entire church joined in for the Lenten preparation. The logic is simpleô self-denial, repentance and giving do not come natural to us. Such tasks require the direction and encouragement of our brothers and sisters in faith.

Because Lenten practices do not come naturally, we must learn to use little when we have much. We must learn to give sacrificially. We must practice repentance when the surrounding cultural becomes comfortable with sin. We must practice self-denial so our lives begin to take the shape of the cross. It is not fun, not flashy and not in vogue. However, in these practices we encounter Godis grace. The only thing able to change self-interested people into interesting people!

While fasting we feast on the presence of God. While repenting we experience the joy of forgiveness. While giving we draw closer to Christ, who gives all. This Lent, then, I pray the church will join me in a time of repentance, self denial and giving. Give up something you@ll miss (especially if it@s something hindering your walk with God!), pray Psalm 51 daily and give away the money you save from fasting.

May God give us the grace for a holy season of Lent and welcome us to His table in a powerful way on Easter morning. Amen.
